World Communion Sunday

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. World Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. It was created as an attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.

The Revised Common Lectionary scriptures assigned for today are Lamentations 1:1–6 and Lamentations 3:19–26 or Psalm 137; Habakkuk 1:1–4; 2:1–4 and Psalm 37:1–9; 2 Timothy 1:1–14; Luke 17:5–10.


